

## Class 36 NEEDLECRAFT

**Note:** Judges are authorized by the Directors of this Society to discard all soiled, defaced or old work and are instructed to award prizes to new and up to date work. The decision of the judge will be final and the judge may withhold any award if in opinion the exhibit is not worthy. All knitting, sewing and quilting must be done by hand, unless otherwise specified. Sample of material or yarn to accompany entry or will be disqualified.

Any Organized Group, (e.g. Women's Institute, I.O.D.E., Women's Auxiliary etc.) may compete as an individual in classes 1-88 inclusive, prize money to go to the Group Treasury but is not allowed to compete at District level.

### QUILTS

The Grand Champion Quilt (must be hand quilted) will compete at the District 5 Meeting in November 2010 and if a winner, goes into competition at the Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies' Convention in February 2011, where the winner receives \$500.00. Exhibitor is permitted to retain ownership of the quilt. Contact the Fair office for 2010 Quilting Rules or our website at [www.miltonfair.com](http://www.miltonfair.com).

If an exhibitor wins Grand Champion or Best of Show at other than her own fair or at more than one fair, the exhibitor must consider the Agricultural Society nearest her home address as the one from which the quilt will be sent to District Meeting.

Prizes will be awarded to the exhibitor who places 1<sup>st</sup> (\$ 25.00), 2<sup>nd</sup> (\$15.00), or 3<sup>rd</sup> (\$10.00) at their District Annual Meeting. If an exhibitor does not wish their quilt to compete in this competition, please include this information on the entry form.

**NOTE:** Quilts in section 1, 2, & 11 must be a minimum of 72" by 90". (Smaller quilts will not be eligible to proceed to the next level of competition.)

**Prize Money in Sections 1-17:** 1st - \$10.00, 2nd - \$9.00, 3rd - \$8.00

**NOTE: 2" square of material or yarn sample used in article to accompany entry or will be disqualified.**

1. Quilt appliqued, quilted, must be at least 72" x 90"
2. Quilt pieced cotton quilted, must be at least 72" x 90"
3. Baby Quilt pieced, quilted, approximate size 36" x 36"
4. Quilt in any pattern, machine quilted, must be at least 72" x 90"
5. Quilt Top pieced not quilted, must be at least 72" x 90"
6. Quilt, made from preprinted panel, machine quilted 72"x92".
7. Miniature Quilt less than 24" x 24" not preprinted
8. Quilt single bed size 45" x 72" any technique machine quilted
9. Lap Quilt, pieced 45" x 45", quilted
10. Quilt, new but using heirloom pattern, i.e. log cabin, wedding ring, etc., hand quilted, must be at least 72" x 90"
11. **NEW QUILT: Machine Quilted**, /not by long arm. Must be solely made and machine quilted by individual, must be a minimum of 72" x 90", winner will go to District competition October 2010.

12. Lap Cover, knitted, 45" x 45"
13. Afghan, knitted in blocks or strips
14. Afghan, knitted in one piece.
15. Afghan, crocheted in blocks or strips

- A. Quilt; minimum size 60" x 80"; any design, hand or machine quilted by either exhibitor or another.
- B. Wallquilt: Traditional design, not to exceed 200 in., must be completely made and quilted by exhibitor
- C. Wallquilt; Abstract or representational, not to exceed 200 in., must be designed by exhibitor, will be judged on innovative design, unusual use of materials and stitches, piecing, embellishments as well as quilting and finishing.
- D. Under 16 years of age; an article of quilting, must be completely made by exhibitor.

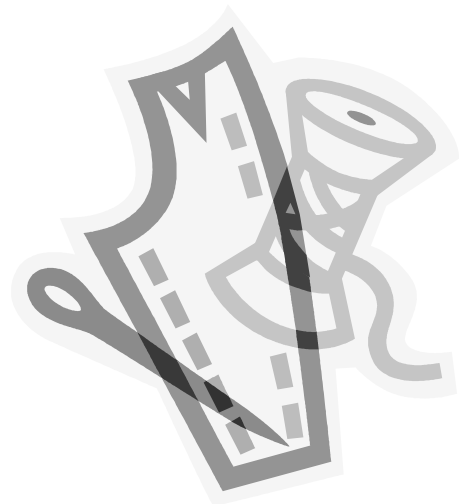
