The decision of the judge will be final and the judge may withhold any award if in opinion the exhibit is not worthy. All knitting, sewing and quilting must be done by hand, unless otherwise specified. **SAMPLE OF MATERIAL OR YARN TO ACCOMPANY ENTRY OR ENTRY WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.**

All exhibits in this class must not have been exhibited at a previous Milton Fair and must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor. Any Group Organization may compete as an individual in this class. Prize money to go to Group Treasurer. Entry tags must be securely fastened to the entry.

Prize money will be: 1st - \$5.00, 2nd - \$4.00, 3rd - \$3.00

1. Dried flower arrangement under 12 inches
2. Homemade Jewelry (any medium) – necklace and bracelet
3. Decorated miniature farm tool – e.g. Kid’s rake, hoe, etc.
4. Miniature class – article suitable for a doll house – not over 3”
5. Quick Craft – a craft from a kit that can be completed in a weekend – please include package
6. An item of folk art on wood
7. A store bought tote bag – embellished
8. Decorated clay pots
9. Handmade sachet, under 6”
10. Four (4) napkin holders representing four (4) seasons, any medium
11. Beaded Suncatcher
12. Item of Plastic Canvas
13. Article of woodwork (not carving) – to be judged on workmanship not painted design
14. An item using rubber stamps or stencils
15. Fridge magnet representing one (1) of the four (4) seasons, any medium
16. Decorated eye glass case – **Dr. Jany SPECIAL**
17. Homemade Garden Ornament – any medium
18. Item of Mosaic Tile, e.g. Clay pot, vase, etc.
19. Perler Bead item – keychain, etc
20. A one (1) page example of “scrapbooking”, featuring a child or children on the farm – **Scrapbook Paradise SPECIAL**
21. Three handmade bazaar items, different techniques, on a tray
22. Recycle something useless into something useful
23. Decorated Bird House – Additional \$5.00 prize donated by **Linda Ricker SPECIAL**
24. Store bought article of clothing embellished with sequins and beads

25. An example of tie dye or batik
26. Item made with pressed flowers
27. Revive an old craft. A new item using an old technique, e.g. quilling, apple doll
28. An item of paper tole
29. Wall decoration – **NOT A WREATH** – e.g. swag
30. Wind Chimes
31. Table Centrepiece, Fall theme.
32. Unusual craft not listed in any of the categories above, under 12” – no knitting or crocheting. Judged on level of appeal, difficulty and quality of workmanship
