O.A.A.S CHILDREN'S SPECIAL Contest is open to youth up to age 15 years as of Dec 31, 2024

 - No nuts
 - 6 cookies to be displayed on a clean, sturdy plate (no paper plates), inside a clear plastic bag
 - No larger than 3"(6.75cm) and no smaller than 2" (5cm)
 - Judging criteria: presentation (cookies) 25 points, general appearance 15 points, internal appearance 15 points, flavour 45 points

The winner from each fair will be eligible to enter at the *District competition* in *October 2024*. If a winner at the *District competition*, than will be eligible to enter at the *Provincial competition in February 2025*.

If the exhibitor has won at more than one fair, the one closest to the exhibitor's home address is the agricultural society from which the entry will be sent to the district competition. The other agricultural societies may send their second place winner into the district competition. An exhibitor may only enter into one district competition.
