IMPORTANT – ALL Entries must be submitted ONLINE via Assist Expo at <https://assistexpo.ca/milton-fall-fair> by Friday September 18, 2026. If you need assistance registering online, please call or visit our office before the deadline date. Late entries WILL NOT BE accepted.

- **ENTRY FORMS:** Please complete all online entries for exhibits early. The office will be open Monday to Friday from 9:00am – 4:00pm daily.
- **ENTRY SUBMISSION:** Entries MUST be submitted online *prior* to Friday Sept. 18th at 4:00pm to receive an entry number. If you need assistance, you can contact the office for help via E-mail office@miltonfair.com or phone: 905-878-5689
- **ENTRY TAGS:** You may pick up your entry tags at the office ahead of time. If not, they will be available Wed. Sept 23rd until 8:30pm or Thurs Sept 24th until 10am.
- **EXHIBITS:** Bring your exhibits (with attached entry tag) to under the Grandstand on Wed. Sept 23rd from 6:00 pm - 9:00 pm or Thurs. Sept 24th from 9:00 am -10:30am.
- **JUDGING:** The halls will be closed at 10:30am and judging will commence at 11:00 am.
- **PICK UP:** Exhibits MUST remain in the halls until closing Sunday, September 27th, 2026. Halls close at 4:30 pm. Pick-up will begin at 5:00 pm and close at 6:00 pm.

All exhibits must be removed between 5:00 pm and 6:00 pm Sunday, September 27th. Halls close promptly at 6:00 pm. The Halton Agricultural Society is not responsible for exhibits not picked up by 6:00 pm. You must present your exhibitor pass in order to pick up your entry.

Prize money for adult classes will be mailed.

4. OAAS MAPLE SYRUP COMPETITION
Pure Maple Syrup, Canada Grade A – Amber

Rules

1. Maple syrup exhibits shall consist of (2) curved Kent style glass bottles (D&G #505188 Syrup Bottle with Handle), of Maple Syrup, Canada Grade A - Amber, each having a capacity of 250 ml
District Competition.
2. Competition is open to all exhibitors of member societies of the OAAS.
3. Exhibitors of honey must be registered beekeepers and the exhibits shown by them must be pure honey from floral sources in their apiaries. Entry must be made solely by the person or family entering the competition. The entries at the fair level, district level and provincial level must be from the same batch.
4. By entering an OAAS competition, the exhibitor agrees to allow their name and exhibit to be part of any promotional activities related to the competition.

District Competition - October 2026

1. Maple syrup exhibits shall consist of one (1) curved Kent style glass bottle (D&G #505188 Syrup Bottle with Handle), of Maple Syrup, Canada Grade A - Amber, having a capacity of 250 ml.
2. Each agricultural society is entitled to send their best of show to the district competition.
3. If the exhibitor has won at more than one fair, the one closest to the exhibitor's home address is the agricultural society from which the entry will be sent to the district competition. The other agricultural societies may send their second-place winner into the district competition. An exhibitor may only enter into one district competition.

The OAAS will award a ribbon to exhibitors of winning entries at each district competition.

Provincial Competition - February 2027

1. Maple syrup exhibits shall consist of two (2) curved Kent style glass bottles (D&G #505188 Syrup Bottle with Handle), of Maple Syrup, Canada Grade A - Amber, each having a capacity of 250 ml.
2. Entries must be labelled on the BOTTOM of the containers only with a supplied entry number or identifier. No other labels will be permitted.
3. All maple syrup should have a flavour characteristic of its respective colour class and be free from any objectionable odour or taste. It is best to sample from the same lot before submitting your entries to the OAAS.
4. Any maple syrup entry containing any form of foreign material will be disqualified from the competition.
5. Maple syrup will be judged using the standards published by the OAAS in Agriculture & Horticulture Judging Standards for Ontario Fairs. An approved maple syrup colorimeter will be used to assess the colour.

1st and 2nd place entries will be placed up for auction at the convention. Other entries will be returned.

Judging Standards

40 points - Flavour 30 points - Density 20 points - Colour 10 points - Clarity
Provincial Prize Money – 1st - \$50.00, 2nd - \$30.00, 3rd - \$20.00

6. OAAS LIQUID HONEY COMPETITION
Pure, Ontario #1, White

Rules

1. Liquid Honey exhibits shall consist of two clear glass containers, each having a capacity of 500 grams (375 ml).
2. Competition is open to all exhibitors of member societies of the OAAS.
3. Exhibitors of honey must be registered beekeepers and the exhibits shown by them must be pure honey from floral sources in their apiaries. Entry must be made solely by the person or family entering the competition. The entries at the fair level, district level and provincial level must be from the same batch.
4. By entering an OAAS competition, the exhibitor agrees to allow their name and exhibit to be part of any promotional activities related to the competition.

District Competition

1. Liquid Honey exhibits shall consist of one (1) clear glass container, having a capacity of 500 grams (375 ml).
2. Each agricultural society is entitled to send their best of show to the district competition.
3. If the exhibitor has won at more than one fair, the one closest to the exhibitor's home address is the agricultural society from which the entry will be sent to the district competition. The other agricultural societies may send their second-place winner into the district competition. An exhibitor may only enter into one district competition.

The OAAS will award a ribbon to exhibitors of winning entries at each district competition.

Provincial Competition

1. Liquid Honey exhibits shall consist of two clear glass containers, each having a capacity of 500 grams (375 ml).
2. Entries must be labelled on the BOTTOM of the containers only with a supplied entry number or identifier. No other labels will be permitted.
3. Any honey entry containing any form of foreign material will be disqualified from the competition.
4. Honey will be judged using the standards printed in the OAAS Agriculture & Horticulture Judging Standards for Ontario Fairs. An approved colorimeter will be used to assess the colour.

1st and 2nd place entries will be placed up for auction at the convention.

Judging Standards

Appearance – 45 points: 15 Density (moisture content), 10 Brightness, 10 Flavour and aroma, 5 Uniformity of honey, 5 Colour

Clarity – 45 points: 15 Free from crystals, 15 Free from pollen, wax, etc., 15 Free from air bubbles, either in suspension or as a froth

Containers – 10 points: 5 Pleasant appearance (of equal size and shape), 5 Uniform level of fill

Provincial Prize Money – 1st - \$50.00, 2nd - \$30.00, 3rd - \$20.00
